

## **Masters Intercounties Championships 2006**

The Annual Masters Inter-counties Championship took place over the weekend of 18th and 19<sup>th</sup> November. Twenty-seven counties took part in the competition this year. Due to the number of counties taking part, the counties compete at several pools throughout the country. The results from each venue are amalgamated to produce a consolidated result.

Cheshire swam at Harrogate along with Yorkshire, Cumbria and Northumberland & Durham. Unfortunately Lancashire which normally competes along side these counties at Harrogate didn't send a team this year.

The event consists of 50 metre sprints for ladies and gents on all four strokes: frontcrawl, back stroke, breast stroke and butterfly in six age groups - up to 24, 25+, 35+, 45+, 55+, 65+. This makes a total of 48 individual swims. In addition to the individual swims there are 20 relay swims.

Cheshire stalwarts Brenda and Tom Walker got Cheshire off to a good start recording 5<sup>th</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place respectively in the 50 m breaststroke. Further good breaststroke results followed with Jeff Rimmer and Frances Buggy both recording 3<sup>rd</sup> place and Russell Crabtree securing 5th place.

The individual events then moved on to butterfly. In the first butterfly race, the men's 65+, Cheshire recorded their first first place of the competition when Neil McKinnon smashed the British Record in 32.01 seconds beating the second place swimmer by more than one and half seconds. Further successful swims followed with Jill Jones taking 3<sup>rd</sup> place, Chris Malpass taking 4<sup>th</sup> and Brenda Walker, Jeff Rimmer and Russell Crabtree all securing 5th place.

The next individual event was the back stroke, again Brenda Walker set the standard clocking a 3<sup>rd</sup> place, quickly followed by Chris Malpass also taking 3<sup>rd</sup> place and John Foskett with a 5<sup>th</sup> place.

The final individual event was the 50 m free, Neil McKinnon again took first place, beating the next swimmer by more than a second, Jill Jones and Brenda Walker added to the tally with a 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively.

Interspersed between the individual races for each stroke the relay races took places, Cheshire had some solid swims but couldn't quite get in the top 3 in any race. All the relays were well placed with one fifth, 3 sixth and 2 seventh place finishes.

In the final count, Cheshire finished 6<sup>th</sup> overall, which is the highest position ever attained. This level of result is achieved by good swims from the other swimmers in the squad who have not been mentioned individually as well as those mentioned. Cheshire took a squad of 26 swimmers in total. The swimmers came from Halton, Sandbach, Ellesmere Port, Hazel Grove, Macclesfield, Trafford and Chester clubs.
