



Position in the 2010 Inter-County Masters Competition: FIRST !! Top County in the country for the second year in succession. This national competition involved 29 counties with the NW & NE round being held at Leeds on the 20/11/10. The Cheshire team won with 1664 points over Middlesex with 1657.5 points.



The 2011 Inter-County Masters competition is on the 19th November 2011 in Leeds.

World Record, European Medallists and British Records: This year it was congratulations to Trafford Metro who took a World Record in the 4x100 freestyle mixed team relay for combined age 240+ years. Neil McKinnon led the race off handing over to Rachel Barton. Jill Jones swam the third leg and the team was brought home by Nev Barton to set a new world mark of 4:40.35.

Neil Mackinnon broke two British records at the British Championships in June 2011 competing in the 70-74 years age group 50m butterfly in a time of 33.93s and the 50m freestyle in 30.17s and collected a third gold medal for the 50m backstroke. Nev Barton, age 57 won the 50m freestyle and set a new British record for the 50m breaststroke with a time of 34.63 seconds.

Tom and Brenda Walker participated in the European Masters in Yalta, Ukraine on the 5-9th September 2011. Tom won gold in the 200m backstroke and three silvers in the 50m, 100m and 200m breaststroke, plus relay medals. Individually Brenda went for a set of medals, winning gold in the 200m backstroke, silver in the 100m backstroke and bronze in the 200m freestyle, in addition to collecting relay medals.

Development Plan: Just before the GB Masters in June we introduced three 2 hour sessions at the 50m pool in Liverpool for the Cheshire Masters. This proved to be very popular. The swimmers reported afterwards very positively and felt it made a big difference to their performance at the GB championships in Leeds. They cited benefits from getting accustomed to the longer course and adjustments to their pacing but also the coaching on starts. We are planning on repeating this in 2012.

Some exciting and competitive swimming was seen in the 40/44, 45/49 and 50/54 age groups. Great relay swims from newcomers Chester Academy in the 100-149 years age group.
